### **School Resource Officer Memorandum Of Understanding**

This Memorandum Of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into by and between by and between the Miami County Sheriff ("Sheriff"), the Board of Miami County Commissioners ("Commissioners") and the Board of Education of Bethel Local Schools ("District"), collectively the "parties", and shall become effective on the date last set forth on the signature page.

## **Scope of Agreement and Services:**

Sheriff agrees to maintain and assign a regularly scheduled School Resource Officer ("SRO") to the District.

Pursuant to Sections 311.29, 505.43 and 3313.37 of the Ohio Revised Code, Sheriff may enter into contracts with a school district, and a school district may enter into such contracts with the Sheriff, to render any police service to the contracting school.

Sheriff and District, pursuant to Sections 311.29 and 3313.951 of the Ohio Revised Code, desire to enter into this MOU.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the provisions set forth below, the parties hereby agree to the following:

### **Mission Statement:**

To promote a safe and secure learning environment for students, faculty, staff and the school community.

#### Goals:

To promote a visible positive image of law enforcement interaction with students, teachers, staff and the school community;

To provide a safe and secure educational environment in partnership with the school system and law enforcement;

To serve as role model and develop a positive image with the student body; and to

Develop a mutual partnership to work with faculty and staff to create a well-rounded atmosphere within the school building(s) and on school grounds.

### **Term of Contract:**

Upon the execution of all parties, this MOU shall commence on July 1, 2019 and remain in effect until May 31, 2022.
